- Date(s) when observed: Originally glimpsed at our feeder on Nov 28, 2020. Positive ID was not confirmed. ID was made on Dec 8 with observation & pictures. Continuing bird has been seen and photographed on Dec 9, 10, 11, & 12.
- Time(s) of day when observed: Nov 28 (10:00), Dec 6 (9:45), Dec 8 (13:00), Dec 9 (11:45, 14:30), Dec 10 (10:30)(14:45), Dec 11 (8:30, 15:30) Dec 12 (8:45, 9:00)

- Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light):
The windows facing feeder and trees look SE. Morning light is behind the bird, Afternoon light is unobstructed from the SW, in the trees & on the feeder.
- Optical equipment (type, power, condition):
Binoculars: Swarovski 8x30, excellent condition
Camera: Canon PowerShot SX730HS, 40x optical zoom, 200x digital - excellent
- Distance to bird(s): Bird on feeder was 2-4 ft from observer behind window. Bird in tree was approx 20 ft from observer behind second-story window.
- Duration of observation: Observations ranged from a few seconds to under 5 minutes. When bird was ID'd observation was 3-4 minutes.
- Habitat: Neighborhood is old & established with mature growth of predominantly pines & oaks. Residence property is adjacent to Tammany Trace bike trail. Bird feeder has a large pine and smaller oak the birds use for staging within 15 feet.

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was observed multiple times at the feeder. Usually had the feeder to itself, eating black sunflower seeds. When disturbed by our movements or the arrival of a Red-bellied Woodpecker, it usually flew to the nearby tree or bushes before flying out of sight.

Stress features that separate it from similar species): I saw feed the chickadees, titmouse, and sparrows at the feeder. Same size as Cardinal with more "bulk". Dark upper mandible & bi-colored beak. Rich orange-buff underparts with more.
