10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Vortex 12s, Nikon D3500 with 200 mm lens

11. Distance to bird(s): ca. 10 feet at minimum

12. Duration of observation: about 15 minutes of viewing, off and on, as it ducked in and out of sight

13. Habitat: acacia and Baccharis scrub

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird loosely foraging with gnatcatchers, kinglets, etc.

15. Description:

Gray, black, and white warbler with yellow lore spot.

Dark gray auricular separated on head from dark gray crown by yellow loral spot and broad white supercilium. Auriculars and crown stripe joined gray of nape/mantle, isolating supercilium as long white blaze, narrowest in front.

Gray above with two white wingbars. Area between wingbars (greater coverts) darker than rest of wing and mantle. Tertials edged white. Folded tail above same dark gray as greater secondary coverts, below white with dark sides. Open tail with outer three rect pairs white with dark outer webs.

White below with sparse dark streaks on flanks.

Bill black, legs blackish, eyes dark brown.

16. Voice: n/a

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation):

No close species of confusion. Yellow loral spot on black and white bird distinctive among warblers.
