- 8. Other observers who independently identified the bird(s): Seems like most active LA birders have gone to see this bird.
- 9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Clear, 10 mph winds. Perpendicular late afternoon light as I looked south toward the bird.
- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Vortex Razor 10x42 ED binoculars, Nikon D7200 with Sigma 150-600 mm f/4.5-6.3 lens, both in good condition.

- 11. Distance to bird(s): About 40 feet away.
- 12. Duration of observation: About 1 minute.
- 13. Habitat: Pasture. A herd of cows were nearby.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Hunkered in a tractor tire that was discarded on the ground.
- 15. I only saw the top of the bird's head as it was looking to my left and away. It was nicely rounded and medium brown with white spots.

- 16. Voice: Not heard.
- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): I suppose another owl could superficially look like this, but there were no ear tufts (not Short-eared Owl), and it was too brown (not enough tan/white) for Barn Owl. Very much a stakeout bird with limited places to pull off, and another birder/photographer was quietly waiting in a nearby pull-off to photograph the bird from their car, so I didn't want to disturb.
