14. Habitat: Area is adjacent to a small park, a large cane field, and the W. Atchafalaya Basin Spillway. Birds mostly seen in tall trees with sparce, winter foliage.

Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Birds observed with perching, flying out to catch insects (wasps?). Also observed birds chasing each other. Birds were silent on 12/21/24. Breer calls were heard and recorded on 12/22/24.




