The bird was simply moving too fast to ready my camera, and truthfully I thought it was going to sit on the telephone wires (where the kingbirds often sit at this known roosting site before flying off to whichever tree they are sleeping in that night). However, I am 100% positive in my identification and feel that I heard the bird well enough to confidently identify this individual.
