stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Resting, some in sleep mode while others were swimming around. All moved around at some point in

time.

Stress features that separate it from similar species): There were eleven in the group. They appeared to be slightly larger than Canvasbacks swimming in the same area. They swam in a fairly low profile at times while at other times they were swimming with their heads held high (maybe because of the choppy waves). They also occasionally held their tails in a cocked position, otherwise flat to the water. Their bodies were long looking. Their bills appeared to be fairly small but were difficult to see. They had bright white breasts and throats. The white did not go up the throats very far before turning dark. The heads were also dark. Their backs were dark. Color could not be discerned at their distant position. The choppy waves hid their sides much of the time but quite often white sides could be seen.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Male Hooded Mergansers also have white breasts but they are also smaller than Canvasbacks. Male HOMEs also occasionally flash their white head crests. Male Norther Shovelers also have white breasts but their large bills would have been visible as well as other body features.
- 18. Photographs or tape recordings obtained? (by whom? attached?): Videos were done by me. Shortened versions of them have been uploaded with my eBird report.
- 19. Previous experience with this species: I have seen them on at least two other occasions on this same lake.
