Light grey head, white neck, yellow belly, green back, brown tail feathers. Long, black bill. (No visible crest on head). Slightly smaller than a Blue Jay, by comparison.

16. Voice: Did not hear the voice, as there was a flock of RWBBs in a nearby tree making tremendous noise. It did not appear to be making calls at all.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Jane Patterson of Audubon Louisiana eliminated Western Kingbird and encouraged me to record its call in order to distinguish TRKI from COKI

18. Photographs or tape recordings obtained? (by whom? attached?): I took photos attached.

19. Previous experience with this species: None. I had no clue what it was and immediately sought Jane Patterson's expertise. I also knew either of those species would be very rare here. We've had strong sustained SW winds, which makes me wonder if it got blown off course???
