10. Optics: Tom-10x42 Bushnell binocs, Janine-Nikon Monarch 8x42, Mary-Alpen 8x40, Susan-binocs not noted.

11. Distance to bird(s): 25 to 30 feet away at the most

12. Duration of observation: 10 to 15 minutes at least.

13. Habitat: low to moderately brushy area (with small trees) adjacent to tall observation tower.

14. Behavior of bird/circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): flying and at rest (perched), likely feeding, but did not see bird with food; stayed in general vicinity entire time when flying around, typically perching about 5 to 6' above the ground when at rest.

15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species, body bulk, shape, proportions, bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species): Tyrannus-type flycatcher (kingbird), larger than Eastern Kingbird (about 9"), with large, heavy, blackish bill, medium gray above, wings & tail darker to blackish, whitish below, dark or blackish mask through eye area.

16. Voice: No vocalizations heard.

17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): All yellow-bellied kingbirds easily ruled out (Gray Kingbird has no yellow). Eastern Kingbird has very dark/blackish plumage above, with a white tail-band and much smaller bill than Gray Kingbird.
