Details: Approximately SUTA size, greenish above, yellow-green below with orangey tones in throat and center of breast. Dark bill. Dusky gray auriculars, yellow orange indistinct spectacles. Called frequently, a hoarse but fairly subdued "chuck". In oaks around playground and cemetery between Landry and Cemetery lanes.

Discussion: Third documented record for Louisiana, first since 1982, and first for Jefferson Paris/Southeast Louisiana. Incredibly, a second similarly plumaged HETA was discovered in Harahan, Louisiana, in northern Jefferson Parish on Jan. 6, 2024 by Cathy DiSalvo, and continued to been for about two weeks.

This Grand Isle individual continued to be seen at least through October 18, by many observers.
