Dusky gray auriculars, yellow orange indistinct spectacles. Called infrequently, a hoarse but fairly subdued "chuck". Mostly in Chinese Tallow, eating tallow fruit.



Paris/Southeast Louisiana. A similarly plumaged HETA was discovered at Grand Isle, Louisiana, in coastal Jefferson Parish on October 16, 2023 by John Nelson and I.

This individual continued to be seen intermittently for about two more weeks by many observers.
