- 7. Other observers accompanying reporter who also *identified* the bird(s): Claire and Tom Hanson were with me.
- 8. Other observers who independently identified the bird(s): Seems like many active LA birders have gone to see this bird. I was the 27th visitor according to Claire and Tom.
- 9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Overcast, 5-10 mph winds.
- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Vortex Razor 10x42 ED binoculars, Nikon D7200 with Sigma 150-600 mm f/4.5-6.3 lens, both in good condition.

- 11. Distance to bird(s): About 50-100 feet away.
- 12. Duration of observation: About 1 minute. On and off for about 30 minutes as it visited the feeding station, offering many extended looks.
- 13. Habitat: Rural yard, surrounded by ag.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation):
 Mixed with American Goldfinches and other feeder birds. Perched in the trees, shrubs, ground, and on feeders, and flying back and forth between perches and feeding stations.
- 15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*):

Popped as brighter yellow than the adjacent American Goldfinches, and most of this color was in the underparts (throat to vent). It had a black cap that blended at the rear of the crown into an olive nape and back. Had two wing bars (tips of greater and median) coverts along with a small white patch at the base of the inner primaries.

Molt limits within the greater covers (inner 4ish replaced) indicates this is a 1st winter (formative plumage) bird.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Most like American Goldfinch, but white primary patch, shape of crown (for late Jan), and yellow pattern all consistent with Lesser over American.
