- 9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Skies were partly cloudy and bird was backlit by sunlight at times. Viewing direction was generally to south-southeast in a manner away from rising sun over lake.
- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Swarovski EL 10x42 binoculars, Kowa 880 Scope with 25-60x Zoom, Nikon Coolpix P1000 camera
- 11. Distance to bird(s): approx. 450 m (1476 feet)
- 12. Duration of observation: for several minutes over the approximate 30 minute span
- 13. Habitat: open lake waters. Lake waters choppy.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was observed swimming and diving in association with a small flock (5-8) of Bufflehead,

generally in an area near river channel marker 10.

- 15. - a. at time of observation: with Heydi Lopes during the entire observation. I was scanning lake waters with binoculars and noticed a duck in flock of Bufflehead that was different. Heydi was on her scope and got on the bird, noting it was a Long-tailed Duck. I then used the scope to get a better look at the bird before attempting to photograph.
