- 12. Duration of observation: Several observations, all short. Between 1 to 3 seconds. Bird moved quickly and often.

- 13. Habitat: Thick vines and bushes
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was foraging every time I saw it. Moving quickly through the vines and bushes. Short flights to cross a trail. It gave it's chipping calls often as it moved around. It would go silent for a few minutes, then start up again. The chipping is how we located the bird.

Much larger than the kinglets it was with and a bit larger than the Orange-crowned that was in the mix. Yellow belly, gray head, throat and breast. Bold, broken, white eyering really stood out. Legs were pinkish.
