- 13. Habitat: Recreational playground with baseball fields surrounded by wooded edge, woof lots, open fields and river batture.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Bird was perched on a telephone wire with CAKI. Initially, the two were just sallying occasionally, but the CAKI began bickering with this bird and in the duration, this bird never said anything.
- 15. Description (include only what was actually seen, not what "should" have been seen; include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids): Yellow-bellied kingbird with bright yellow from undertail coverts all the way up the upper breast, where it becomes dingy, offset by a whitish throat, dark head with black mask through the eye, heavier billed-than WEKI, notched tail with no white edging to the outer rectrices.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): WEKI by smaller bill, lighter gray head, extending lower into chest, black tail with white outer edging to the rectrices, cleaner transition on chest than CAKI, no white malar.
