9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Broad daylight. Bird was observed from the highway looking east toward the Port Manchac facility. Bird was on the wires or in short scrub

10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): Swarovski scope 25x-55x, Nikon P950 camera, Vortex bins 8x42

11. Distance to bird(s): between 150 and 350yards

12. Duration of observation: 1 hr 23 mins on 01/03 and 45 min on 01/04

13. Habitat:Edge of marsh near port facility. All the kingbirds seem to like the wires by Port Manchac for foraging as well as the tallow trees in the back of the facility and along the road

14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): Sitting on wire, flycatching from wires, flycatching from scrubby trees

15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen;* include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): Large yellow fronted flycatcher with gray back, greenish upper back. Yellow went all the way to neck area. Bill was large, especially when compared to Western Kingbirds in same area. Rectangular darker gray eye/ear patch visible. No white outer retrices as on WEKI.

16. Voice: I thought I heard a Tropical call at one point but did not get a recording so am not satisfied.

I subsequently heard this bird call to confirm that it's a TRKI. I don't have a recording, unfortunately. I did see on ebird that others have heard it calling as well but I don't know if they got recordings or will do a long form.
