Details: An obvious large swan with a fairly white upper body, dusky neck and darker buffy-dusky head and underparts. Some faint duskiness to tips of primaries and retrices, but wings and tail otherwise white.


Legs and bill black, with perhaps a trace of pinker color at inner base of *maxilla*, but difficult to be sure in overcast conditions at some distance. No trace of yellow.

Bill sloped quite evenly, Canvasback-like, with no curve to *maxilla*. Black facial skin extended to eye and formed a "v" on forehead with white head feathers.

Voice: not heard.

Discussion: It was associating loosely with ducks and other birds in shallow impoundments, feeding at times, occasionally dabbling; seen standing, swimming, and flying. It seemed quite wary, standing alert and flushing two or three times despite our staying a distance away and remaining in the vehicle, though it circled and tended to land not all that far away but out of sight in other impoundments. No bands.
