- 7. Other observers accompanying reporter who also *identified* the bird(s): Dale Hamilton Was the original finder of the bird.

- 9. Light conditions (position of bird in relation to shade and to direction and amount of light): Excellent light from over our shoulders.
- 10. Optical equipment (type, power, condition): 10x40 Zeiss Binocs and Nikon P-900 camera.
- 11. Distance to bird(s): 30-40 yards
- 12. Duration of observation: 3-5 minutes. When we were getting the scope out, a truck

passed and the bird flew.

- 13. Habitat: active crawfish farms. It was sitting on a small earthen levee between two ponds.
- 14. Behavior of bird / circumstances of observation (flying, feeding, resting; include and stress habits used in identification; relate events surrounding observation): The bird was resting and giving us the eye.
- 15. Description (include only what was actually seen, *not what "should" have been seen*; include if possible: total length/relative size compared to other familiar species; body bulk, shape, proportions; bill, eye, leg, and plumage characteristics. Stress features that separate it from similar species, *or for species that are known to hybridize frequently, stress features that help eliminate possible hybrids*): In the field, I saw a lighter washed out bird which prompted me to shoot several shots before it flew. Once photos were reviewed I saw the lack of a strong white malar stripe and yellow from the throat which wrapped up into the malar area. Paul Conover also pointed out the barring on the back.
- 16. Voice: No vocalization.
- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): EAME would have a stronger white malar stripe.
