Stress features that separate it from similar species): Tanager-type passerine, about 7.5" long, tanager-type bill very noticeable (pale or flesh colored, thick, but not pointed like an oriole); olive-yellow above, yellow on upper breast to whitish or very pale yellow on belly (probably a young female); wingbars very noticeable. Ruled out all other tanagers due to wingbars; ruled out all winter icterids due to bill shape, size and color.
16. Voice: Silent.
17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation): Other tanagers and Baltimore and Bullock's Orioles. Eliminated as described above (bill size/shape/color), wingbars
