Large *Buteo*-shaped hawk with bright white tail with dark subterminal band. Back and upper wings were dark gray. Upper wings with brown "shoulders." Brilliant white underneath.

- 17. Similar species (include how they were eliminated by your observation):

No other species found in Louisiana has the white tail with dark subterminal, gray back, and brown shoulders. The only other *likely* hawk would've been a Krider's Red-tailed Hawk, but that species lacks the obvious tail band and is brown above rather than gray. Swainson's Hawk is shaped differently and mostly brown above.
