Subadult, superficially adult-like, but with fine, close vermiculated barring on underwings and underparts of body. Otherwise with bold white tail with dark subterminal tail band, dark upperparts, bay patches on shoulders.

The throat also had a dark patch which I tried to compare the extent of on 1 Jan and 27 Jan photos, but I can't tell if this is one or two birds. Others might see something I've missed.

This is definitely not one of the two birds I reported earlier in the fall (both of which had white underparts).
