7:15 - 8:00 PM. Program: "Sparrow Identification - I Promise, It's Fun" by Erik Johnson, PhD.

Did you know that there are 29 species of sparrow on the Louisiana list (not including House Sparrow)? Audubon Delta's Director of Conservation Science, Erik Johnson, will present on the charming little brown birds that give bird watchers headaches to identify, and turn complexity into elegance...we hope.

Erik joined the National Audubon Society in April 2011 and currently serves as the Director of Conservation Science for Audubon Delta, a regional office that includes Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Before coming to Audubon, Erik's graduate work at Louisiana State University included researching the effects of forest fragmentation on Amazonian bird communities and understanding the effects of fire management on pine savannas species, especially Henslow's Sparrows. Erik has been active in Louisiana's birding community for over 20 years and serves as Louisiana's Christmas Bird Count regional editor, a member of Louisiana's Bird Records Committee, and Director of the Louisiana Bird Observatory. Erik lives in Sunset, Louisiana.

#### Events for Saturday, 25 January 2025:

Field trips: Field trip reservations will be made Friday night at the meeting, with the exception of the sparrow banding trip at the ULL Farm which requires pre-registration (see below). PLEASE be sure to give your cell phone number and your eBird user name to your trip leader. Remember to top-off your fuel tank before any field trip! All participants in LOS Winter Meeting 2024 are free to bird these areas on your own at any time of day. Please thank your trip leaders!!

Sparrow banding with Erik Johnson at the ULL Farm. 6:30am. Maximum of 12 participants. Half-day trip. The morning will start with birding early morning sparrow locations. Banding will begin after birding. Sparrows banded in recent years include Henslow's, LeConte's, Grasshopper, Lincoln's, Vesper, Fox, and Field. Lake Martin Birding with by Rob Dobbs and Andy From. Leave hotel by 6:00am. Maximum 12 participants. Half-day trip. East side along the levee, and west side entering near the Nature Conservancy – Cypress Preserve.

Lake Martin Birding by Kayak with by Ken Eyster and Mike Van Etten. Half-day trip. Maximum of 15 participants. Meet in the Lobby by 1:00pm to caravan, or meet at 1:45pm at Lake Martin Boat Launch, 1209 Rookery Road, Breaux Bridge. Birding will take you through a bald cypress swamp by kayak. The 200 acres in the center of the lake is only 5 feet deep. Kayak rental (includes life jackets, paddles, and kayak) is available for a \$30 for single or \$55 for tandem, but if you bring your own, there is no fee. Pre-registration is required and begins 1 January, 2025 at 8:00am. Acadiana Park and Nature Station with James Smithers and Karen Terrell. Half-day trip. Maximum of 12 participants. Meet in the Lobby at 7:00 AM where you will caravan to the park at 1205 East Alexander Street, Lafayette. The park is along an ancient tributary of the Mississippi River, now called Francois Coulee, which flows into the Vermilion River. Upon conclusion, birders will lunch on their own. Moncus Park may be birded after lunch for those wishing to continue.

Matt Conn's Environmental Reclamation Property with Matt Conn and Bill Finney. Half-day trip. Maximum of 12 participants. Meet at 7:00am Lydia at Dago's Grocery and Gas Station at 3902 Darnall Road, New Iberia, to caravan to the property. Property is an area of 76 acres that includes habitat for wading birds, forest passerines, and resident avian species.

7:30 - 9:00 PM. Program: "Birding in Southwest Madagascar" by Ken Eyster.

Ken Eyster was born in Lafayette and got his BS degree in biology at USL. He then earned an AS in Industrial Technology from USL with a focus on electronics. While attending USL he worked part time at Lafayette General Medical Center in the Clinical Engineering Department. After graduating he was hired full time in that same department and become one of the first 1200 Certified Biomedical Equipment Technicians in the US. After approximately 15 years working in Clinical Engineering, he transferred to the Radiology Department. As a Certified Radiological Equipment Specialist, Ken managed and serviced over \$14 million worth of imaging equipment throughout LGMC.

After leaving LGMC he installed and serviced Hologic's digital mammography units, doctors 'mammography reading workstations and bone densitometry units throughout Louisiana.

Ken has been a Life Member of the LOS for over 45 years. Ken remembers attending the LOS meetings in the smoke-filled Fred's Lounge in Cameron and he especially enjoyed listening to Dr. Lowery discuss birding with his dad. His dad, Dr. Marshall Eyster, taught Ornithology at USL, so Ken was exposed to birding at a very young age. Uniquely, both of Ken's parents, Marshall and Grace, were Past Presidents of the LOS.

Besides birding, he enjoys kayaking and photography and is on the board of the Lafayette Photographic Society. He also belongs to the Lake George Gem and Mineral Club (Colorado) and enjoys going on their rock collecting trips while in Colorado visiting his sons, family and grandchildren. Recent distant birding trips other than Madagascar were Costa Rica and a winter trip to the Sax-Zim bog in Minnesota.

LOS has reserved a block of rooms at the Homewood Suites by Hilton--Lafayette Airport, 201 Kaliste Saloom Road, in Lafayette, 70508 for \$115.00/night, plus applicable state & local taxes. Some members may find a lower rate through a loyalty program such as AAA, AARP, or the Hilton Rewards Program, but this rate really does appear to be a steal, so don't miss the deadline. Directions to hotel: From I-10, take the NE Evangeline Thruway (US HWY 90) south at the I-10 interchange with I-49. Stay on this highway until you turn west onto E. Kaliste Saloom Road. The hotel is immediately past the intersection of Kaliste Saloom and Pinhook. Locate dining suggestions include: The nearest Meche's Donut King is a half-mile away at 2025 W. Pinhook. Marcello's Italian Restaurant is at 340 Kaliste Saloom, Suite C. PJ's Coffee is at 1501 W. Pinhook. Smoking Joe's BBQ (in a Chevron station) is 600 E. Kaliste Saloom. Blanchard's BBQ (lunch only) at 2023 W. Pinhook Rd., Fat Pat's Bar and Grill is at 626 Verot School Road. Mercy Kitchen is at 1312 Verot School Road. Thai With Love is at 924 Kaliste Saloom Road.
